INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

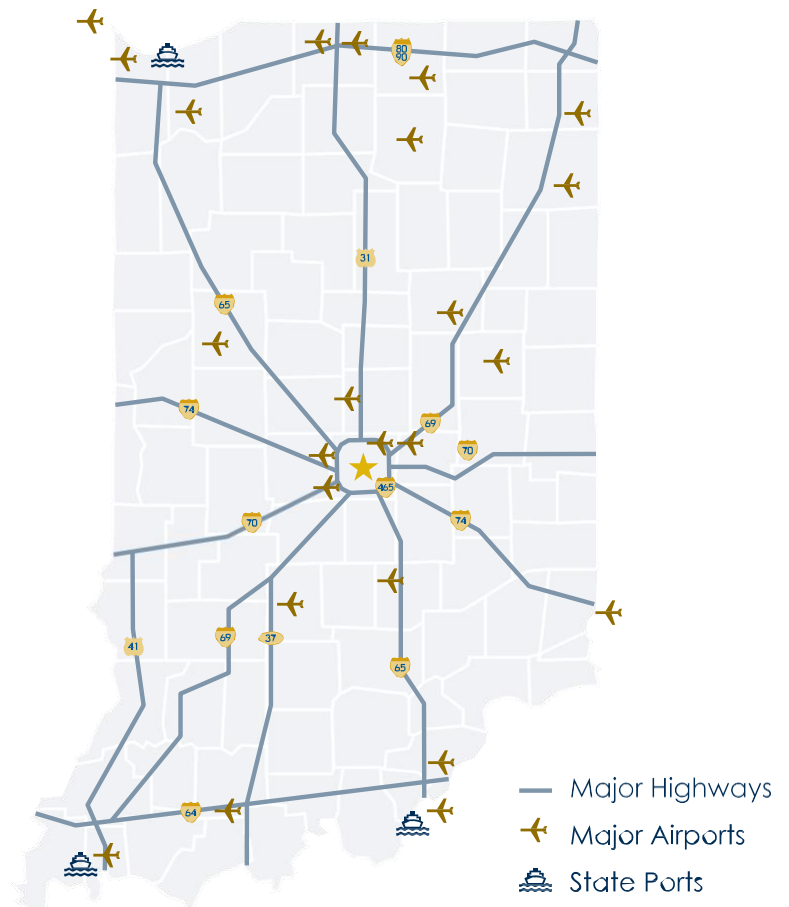
Indiana is a global logistics leader and offers companies a strong competitive advantage when it comes to reaching North American and world markets. Known as the “Crossroads of America,” Indiana ranks in the top 10 in 107 significant logistics-related categories across the U.S. Indiana is a national leader in pass-through interstates, home to the 2nd largest FedEx air hub worldwide, and 3rd in total freight railroads. With three maritime ports that together rank 6th in waterborne shipping, Indiana provides the only statewide port system with direct waterway access to two U.S. coasts. These assets support any logistics-related enterprise and encourage companies to expand or locate their operations here in Indiana.

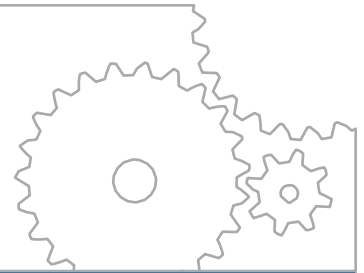
Other rankings include:

- 6TH largest cargo airport (Indianapolis International Airport)

Indiana’s strong workforce in the truck transportation, warehousing, and freight rail subsectors all rank in the top 10 by employment across the country. MAJOR MOVES

Through the Major Moves program, Indiana will invest over \$11 billion by the end of calendar year 2015. The following will be accomplished:

- 87 roadways will be completed or substantially under construction
- 65 new or reconstructed interchanges
- 413 centerline miles of new roadways will be constructed
- 6,350 miles of highway will be resurfaced
- 1,070 bridges will be rehabilitated or replaced
